Excursions 2018-19

One of the great strengths at Earlston is the commitment shown by staff, students and parents to **creating our community.** We feel that the many and varied excursions offered by staff through the year are vital in helping to foster this.

This booklet gives **an outline** of what you can expect for your child in S2-3.

We also hope that this will help parents and carers **plan ahead** to give your child the best chance of experiencing some of these opportunities in future years. Things change so not everything will be offered next year; but most do continue.

All of these are offered by staff working voluntarily because they believe giving our young people these wider experiences. We want our community **to work together** to make them fantastic opportunities.

Our aims (Learning intentions):

- Relationships: to build strong connections between the school community
- Respect: to encourage everyone in school to respect each other
- Challenge: to stretch students out of their comfort zone and to encourage independence
- Problem solving and team building
- Supporting curricular learning
- Give all students an out-of-school learning experience, if possible residential, by the time they leave school
- S2-3 parents who are interested in an excursion complete an option choice form to request a place.
 This can be done online or via the paper form attached here and should be handed in by 10th
 September. You should choose a first-choice activity and a reserve in case there are not places. All S2-3s are expected to go on an excursion.
- 2. If an activity is over-subscribed places will be **allocated randomly**, and we will then do our best to make sure your child gets their second choice.
- 3. Once you have been allocated a place you can pay the **deposit via parent pay to secure your place** or in cash to the school office. The trip leader will then give you more information and details on how to pay. Anyone who has difficulty in paying should contact the school as there may be support available.
- 4. There will be a parents' meeting for each excursion on the first week back in after the Easter holidays.
- 5. Activities aren't guaranteed to run as described; many depend on numbers of students and other factors.

Students' Responsibilities on Excursions

By opting into our excursions programme you are agreeing to this code of conduct.

Everybody going on an excursion has the right to enjoy and to learn. Many of us have saved up to come. Staff give up their spare time for free. We all therefore have the responsibility to make everything go well.

By joining our activities students therefore agree to:

- act safely
- **follow instructions** of any leaders or other adult helpers (for example lights-out times)
- dress and behave appropriately
- be sensitive to local codes and customs
- look out for anything that might hurt or threaten themselves or anyone in the group and report it
- **be legal** (laws can be different abroad- you must follow both British and foreign laws. For example alcohol, cigarettes and bangers are not allowed)
- follow school rules
- be polite
- be a credit to our school, our area and our country
- look after myself and others

FAQs

How much money should I take?

Most excursions are fully costed, including meals, with the possible exception of the return bus journey. We therefore recommend money only for snacks, souvenirs and the occasional treat. £5-£10 a day is a good rule of thumb. Any more can be upsetting for other students and difficult to manage for staff.

Are we allowed mobile phones?

It depends on the excursion. The same rules apply as in school: it is entirely up to the excursion leader's discretion. For example you will have no use for them on the Ardeche excursion; but they are useful for emergencies when on the Battlefields excursion.

What happens if I have to cancel?

Deposits are not refundable. The balance has been paid travel company is not obliged to compensate for anyone who drops out, other than for medical cases signed off by a doctor. Once a place on the trip is secured, if at any time before the trip, your child's behaviour at Earlston HS is judged by the Senior Leadership Team to cause concern that they might misbehave badly on the trip, we reserve the right to withdraw your child from the trip. If there is no one on the waiting list, you would still be liable for the full cost of the trip. If behaviour is inappropriate on the excursion we reserve the right to send the child home at parents' expense.

What if there's a problem on the trip?

Please encourage your child to always speak to the teacher first. We aim to encourage independence and self-reliance and a team ethos to solving problems and we value parents' support with this.

What happens?

Day 1 - Friday 18th May 2018 depart school and begin our journey to Domaine de Segries

Day 2 - Arrive at camp in the morning to have breakfast, settle in and get ready for the day ahead. In the morning there could be mountain

biking followed by an afternoon rock climbing.

Day 3 - Visit the Orgnac Caves and the Haribo Museum.

Day 4 - Set off on the two day canoe down the Ardeche river and camp out under the stars at night.

Day 5 - Finish the two day descent of the Ardeche river and return to camp.

Day 6 - Kayaking all day with a picnic lunch beside the Ardeche river.

Day 7 - High ropes course in the morning followed by archery and problem solving in the afternoon.Leave camp after dinner for our return journey.

Day 8 - Friday 25th May 2018 travel back to Earlston High School.

Why should I go?

After activities are done for the day there is a variety of evening entertainment for students to get involved in such as visiting the local town, swimming, capture the flag and a disco. During this trip students will be given many opportunities to widen and enhance their skill sets. Responsibility is one of the most important skills we aim to develop in students attending this trip not only whilst we are away but also during the preparation for this trip. Some of the other skills we hope this trip will help to develop are:

Teamwork, Resilience, Self-awareness, Related Skills, Leadership, Confidence, Communication, Problem Solving, and a Positive Attitude to Challenge and Adventure

Day 1:

• We would leave from Edinburgh airport 20th May to fly to Krakow.

Day 2:

• Wieliczka Salt Mines, Guided tour of Wawel Castle

Day 3:

- Tours of Auschwitz Birkenau Concentration Camp (3 hour tour)
- Guided tour of Old Town and Jewish Quarter (up to 2 hours)
- Schindler's Factory Museum
- Galicia Museum (including a meeting with Holocaust Survivor or relative subject to availability)

Day 4:

- Rynek Underground Museum with audio guide
- Kosciuszko Mound
- Flight back to Edinburgh (arriving approx. midnight/early hours Friday morning)

Why should I go?

Krakow is one of the oldest and most beautiful cities in Poland, and an exceptional school trip destination for any student that will remain in their memory for years to come.

This trip will give students the opportunity to reflect on what they see and hear – more than one person has said it was 'life changing' to see and hear from holocaust survivors and to see the factory at the centre of the film Schindler's list.

For a true taste of the authentic Polish way of life, where better place than the grand town square at the centre of the city. The square is actually the biggest medieval town square in Europe. It houses St. Mary's Basilica, a gothic church that dates back to the 13th century and

that is now surrounded by local marketplaces, restaurants and cafes.

There are also few cities that provide such a thought-provoking experience of wartime history. This trip to Krakow enables students to gain a real sense of what life was like for Jewish communities prior to and during the Second World War. This is an invaluable and unforgettable learning experience for all who visit.

Skills/values you will be focussing on are:

1. Resilience.

- Resilience is a person's ability to respond to pressure and the demands of daily life.
- On the trip this could be never giving up, trying your hardest, learning from your mistakes, having a positive attitude, etc.

2. Organisation & Timekeeping.

• This would include getting up on time and arriving on time for meals, meeting points, having what you need for the day, managing your money, etc.

3. Problem solving.

- This would include how you get from one place to another without getting lost, finding things in your room that you may have mislaid, etc.
- Any difficulties with other people on the trip and engaging with activities.

4. Respect.

- To each other and staff including the bus drivers.
- Respect of property in the hotel and at attractions,
- Members of the public as you walk through the streets and engage with attractions/hotel staff and those working in shops.

You will cover all the training for the expedition section of the Duke of Edinburgh's Bronze Award in one week rather than attending sessions through the year.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday will be in and out of school, learning about map skills, using a compass, First Aid, putting up tents, cooking outdoors and how to keep safe. Then on the Thursday we go off on a 2-day expedition into the hills of the Scottish Borders, camping overnight.

Why should I go?

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is one of the best recognised Awards for demonstrating your resilience, independence and ability to work in a team. You will also have fun outdoors with friends. There may be the chance to progress to Silver or even Gold in the future.



What else do I need to know?

There are two options for doing Duke of Edinburgh this year. You can either do the normal approach of Friday afternoon sessions or this option allows you to get a big chunk of it done in the warm summer months. You'll still have to do your volunteering, physical and skill sections in your own time starting in October and attend Tuesday lunchtime meetings to help organise this. You'll also need to be assessed in an expedition later in the year.
