Our young people may require additional support in the learning environment that they encounter, due to social and emotional factors, health and disability and the young person's family circumstances.

At Earlston High School we aim to respond flexibly to the diversity of learners' challenges with the resources we have at our disposal. We strive to respond in such a way that barriers to participation, learning and achievement are removed, inclusion and equality are promoted and a high quality education for all is developed and sustained. Our key inclusion aims are:

- To recognises that any learner may require additional support at some stage.
- To acknowledge that there are a range of experienced barriers exemplified in the protected characteristics as outlined in the Equality Act (2010) (age, race, disability, religion and belief, gender reassignment, sex, sexual orientation, marriage and civil partnership and pregnancy and maternity) and in addition barriers that may be created through the experience of poverty, young carers, non-binary pupils, care-experienced pupils and those who have English as an additional language, and we will work to overcome these.
- To strive for participation of all in the classroom, school and community.
- To create a common curriculum, systems of assessment, and social and extracurricular activities to meet all learners needs.
